# 1 **Getting Started**

## **Overview**

The KODAK Picture Kiosk provides your customers a way to create prints and enlargements from a variety of input sources (photos, CDs, DVDs, digital camera cards, USB flash drives, camera phones, and Wi-Fi devices). Outputs include paper, KODAK Picture CD, KODAK Archive DVD, collages, greeting cards, invitations, photo books, and calendars with several layout combinations and editing capabilities.

The Kiosk consists of:

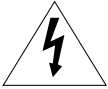
- A processor with MICROSOFT WINDOWS Operating System, DVD/CD-RW drive, Camera Card Readers, and USB drive
- Picture Kiosk Plus Software, Version 9.X
- Color touch-screen monitor
- Receipt Printer

The KODAK Picture Kiosk is available in several different configurations. Regardless of your configuration, this user's guide contains the necessary information to operate your Kiosk.

## Using This Guide



This symbol alerts you to the presence of uninsulated “dangerous voltage” within the product’s enclosure that may be of sufficient magnitude to constitute the risk of electric shock.



This symbol alerts you to the presence of important operating and maintenance instructions.



This symbol alerts you to the presence of a hot surface. Do not touch. This symbol appears next to the thermal print head.

## Before Using the Kiosk

Make sure:

- You have read and understand the safety information (see the Safety and Compliance guide packed with your Kiosk).
- Paper and ribbon are loaded (see the chapter for your printer).
- The printer has been calibrated (see the chapter for your printer).

## Turning on the Kiosk

The Picture Kiosk must be connected to a continuous source power outlet.

1. Turn on the power for all connected equipment.
2. If you have a Picture Kiosk G20, press the power switch on the back of the Console.
3. If you have the M1 Order Station, press the power switch on the face plate of the Console.

## Turning off the Kiosk

NOTE: If you would like to use the auto shutdown and startup feature, see [“Using Auto Shutdown and Startup” on page 2-5](#).

Turn off the Kiosk when it will not be used for extended periods of time. You should turn off the Kiosk once every 24 hours.

Before you turn off the power:



1. Touch *Setup*.



2. Touch *Shutdown System*.

3. Select:

- *Shutdown*—to shut down the system.
- *Restart*—to restart the system.
- *Sleep*—to put the system in sleep mode.

NOTE: Sleep only appears if it is enabled. See [“Using Auto Shutdown and Startup” on page 2-5](#).

4. Touch *Yes* at the prompt.

5. Turn off the power to all other connected equipment.

NOTE: If it is necessary to turn the system back on, **wait 10 seconds** before powering on the Console.

## Navigating the Software

On any screen, touch:



*Start Over* to return to the Main screen.



*Shopping Cart* to view the contents of your order.

Touch the Menu icon, in the upper left corner of the screen, to access:



*Prints from Mobile* to access the Prints from Mobile work flow.



*Order Management* to access active and completed orders and the import queue.



*Claim Online Order* to claim an on-line order.

NOTE: This button appears only if you have Online Orders enabled in User Mode. See [page 2-27](#).



*Biometric ID Photo* to create an Biometric ID Photo.

NOTE: This button appears only if you have the Manual Biometric ID Photo Module V2.0 installed.



*Setup* to go to the Setup screen.

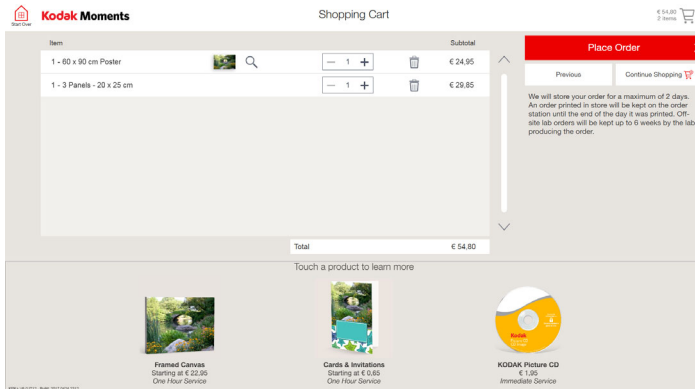


*View All Products* to view the products available on the Kiosk.

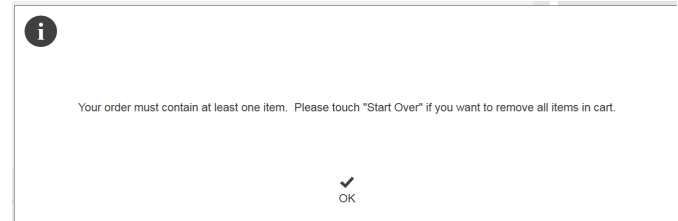
# Viewing the Shopping Cart

From the Shopping Cart, you can:

- View the items in your cart
- View the details of an item
- Change the order quantity of an item
- Delete an item
- Continue shopping
- Place your order



NOTE: If you only have one item in your cart, and you chose to delete it, the following message appears:



Click **OK** to dismiss the message. Click **Start Over** to remove the item from your cart.



## Using the Keyboard and Mouse

You may be required to use the keyboard or mouse to perform certain functions. You can also use the keyboard to enter text, in some work flows, instead of using the on-screen keyboard.

### Connecting the keyboard and mouse

1. Shut down the Kiosk and disconnect the power cord from the power source. See [“Turning off the Kiosk” on page 1-3](#).
2. Connect the keyboard to the back of the console.
3. Connect the mouse to the back of the console.
4. Connect the power cord to the power source and turn on the power to the Kiosk.

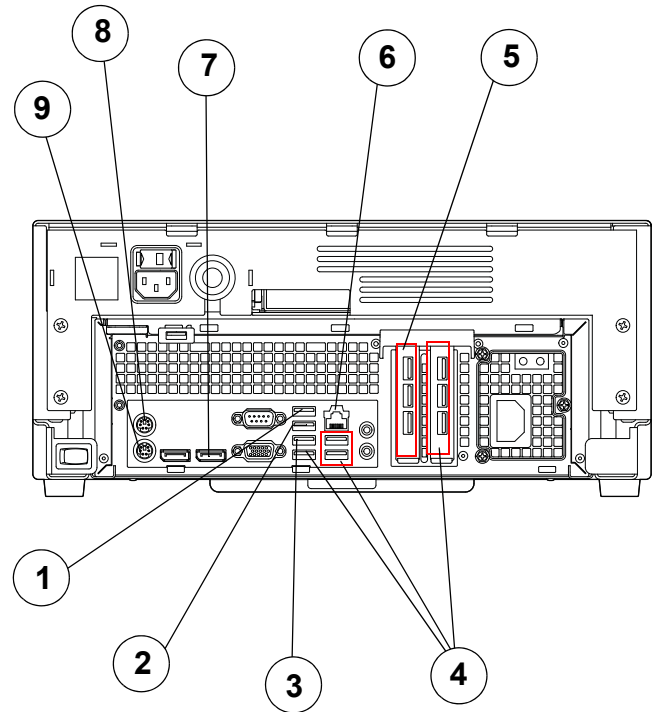
### Disconnecting the keyboard and mouse

1. Shut down the Kiosk and disconnect the power cord from the power source. See [“Turning off the Kiosk” on page 1-3](#).
2. Disconnect the keyboard and store it in a safe place.
3. Disconnect the mouse from the back of the console. Store the mouse in a safe place.
4. Connect the power cord to the power source and turn on the power to the Kiosk.

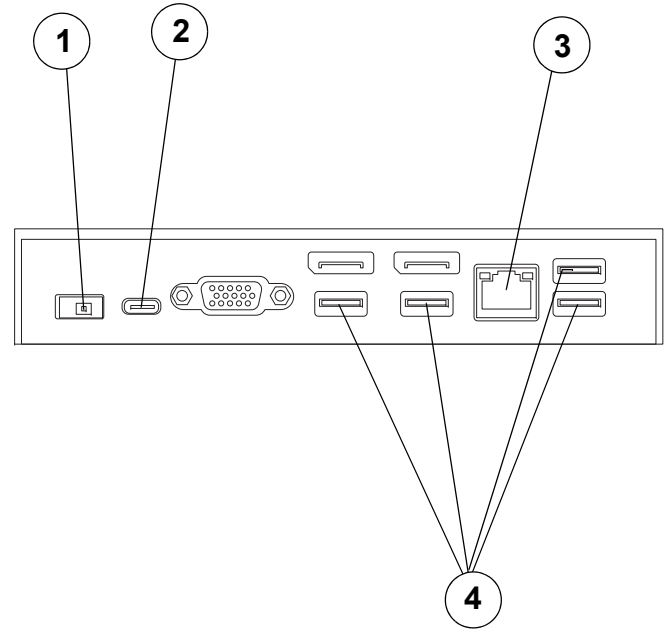

## 2 **Setting up the Kiosk**

You can select specific features to make the Kiosk unique. Use the information in this chapter to set up the Kiosk.

### **Accessing the Setup Screen**

Access the procedures in this chapter through the Setup screen. To access the Setup screen, touch the Menu icon, in the upper left corner of the screen and then touch *Setup*.



### **Hiding the Setup Button**

When this feature is enabled, the Setup button is removed from the Main screen.

To access the Setup screen, touch the KODAK MOMENTS logo in the upper left corner of the screen.

By default, this feature is disabled. If you would like to turn it on, see [“Setting the Retailer Preferences” on page 2-28.](#)

## **Configuring System Settings**

From the Configure System Settings screen you can set up:

- Passwords
- Languages
- Auto shutdown
- Auto startup
- System volume
- Date and time
- Store information
- Receipt information
- Import queue (see [page 9-7](#))
- Order Management
- Local Area Connection
- Host/Satellite information

### Setting up and Changing Passwords

Set separate passwords for:

**Setup Screens**—when you enable the Setup Password, only authorized users can access the Setup screen.

**Printing**—allow printing only when approved by authorized users.

You can enable print passwords for individual options:

- Kiosk Orders—restricts printing, Make Picture CD output, to authorized users.
- Lab Orders—restricts minilab output to authorized users.
- Queue Manager—restricts Order Management access to authorized users.



1. From the Setup screen, touch *Configure System Settings*.



2. Touch *Select Passwords*.

3. Touch next to each password that you want to turn on.

*A check mark appears.*

NOTE: Touch the check mark next to the password if you want to turn it off.



4. Touch the keypad icon to enter the new password.

NOTE: Your password can be a maximum of six numbers.



5. Enter the password using the on-screen keypad and touch *OK*.



6. Touch *Save*.

## Setting the Language



1. From the Setup screen, touch *Configure System Settings*.



2. Touch *Localization*.

3. Select a measurement system:

- English
- Metric

4. Select the primary language.

5. Select the secondary language.

NOTE: Select *None* to display only the primary language.

Save

6. Touch *Save*.

## Displaying a Language

You can set the Kiosk display to toggle between two languages.



1. Touch the *Language* icon on the Main screen.

2. To return to the first language, touch the *Language* icon again.

NOTE: The Language icon does not appear unless the Kiosk is set up to display a secondary language. See "[Setting the Language](#)" on page 2-3.

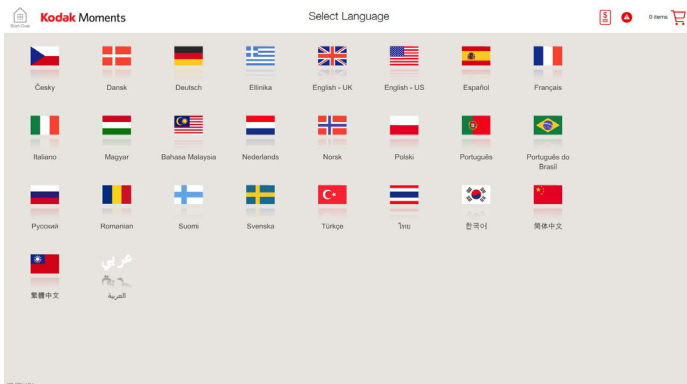
### Showing the Language Selection Screen

To display the Language Selection screen, enable this feature on the Retailer Preference screen (see “[Setting the Retailer Preferences](#)” on [page 2-28](#)).



1. From the Main screen, touch the globe button.

*The following screen appears.*



2. Select a language.

*The Main screen appears in the language selected.*

3. If the customer:

- Stops using the Kiosk, the Kiosk returns to the primary language and the attract loop starts.
- Selects *Start New Order*, the Language Selection screen appears in the language that they selected.

## Using Auto Shutdown and Startup

To configure the Kiosk to start up and shut down automatically:

**IMPORTANT:** *Make sure that you:*

- *Shut down the Kiosk using auto or manual shutdown.*
- *Leave the power to the Kiosk on.*

- Photo Book upsell—adds a Photo Book Upsell icon to the order summary screen.

### Using Large Image Set Navigation

When digital media is detected by the Kiosk, images are sorted by date and folder, making image selection easier and faster.

NOTE: *Sort by Folder* only appears if images are organized by folder on the digital media.

### Using the Compressed CD Option

When there is a CD order that spans to multiple CDs, the consumer can choose to get two CDs or to compress their images to fit on to one CD.

### Using the Kiosk Network Routing Screen Option

When enabled, this option only applies to multi-station configurations. A traditional multi-station configuration allows a satellite Kiosk to use its own devices or those of a host Kiosk.

When the Kiosk Network Routing screen is shown, you can configure the satellite to use the devices of any other Kiosk in the same group.

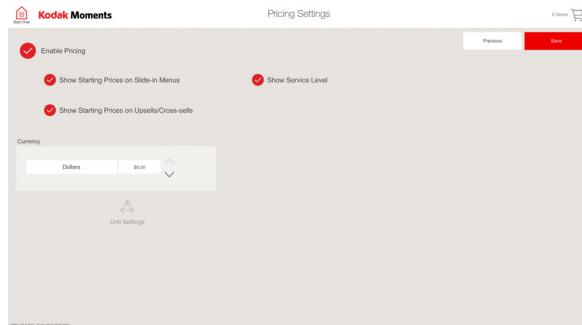

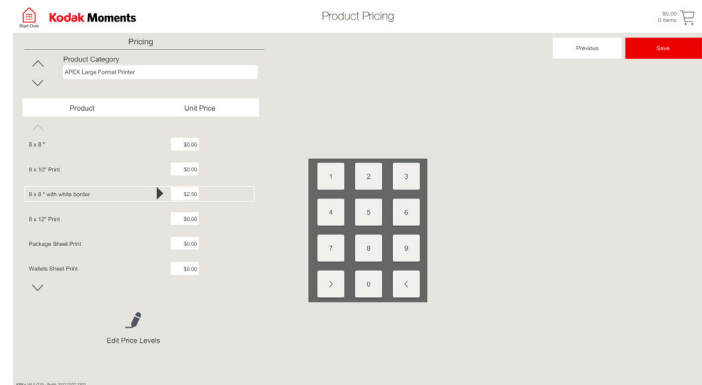

- 15 prints—they would be charged \$11.75  $((15 \times 0.65) + 2.00)$ .
- 25 prints—they would be charged \$16.50  $((25 \times 0.60) + 1.50)$ .
- 35 prints—they would be charged \$20.25  $((35 \times 0.55) + 1.00)$ .
- 45 prints—they would be charged \$22.50  $(45 \times 0.50)$ .

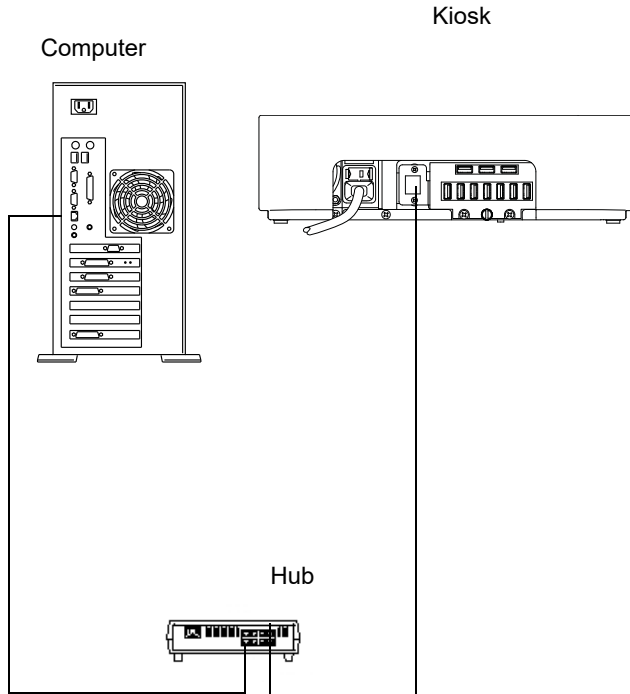

## **7 Making ID Photos**

### **Guidelines for Using Digital Cameras for ID Photo Applications**

When taking ID Photos with a digital camera, start with these settings and change them, as needed, for your site.

1. Use a neutral background. Avoid very dark colors or reflective surfaces.
2. Use the following settings for your digital camera:
  - Quality—best available
  - Resolution—highest available
  - Exposure—Automatic or Normal exposure
  - Focus—Multi-spot or Automatic focus
  - Flash—Automatic or Fill flash
  - JPEG, TIFF, or BMP file format
  - Date stamp off

NOTE: Not all digital cameras include these settings. Set the camera to produce the highest quality images available.

3. When taking the picture, hold the camera vertically and position the subject so that the head fills 1/3 to 1/2 of the viewfinder. Make sure that the subject's head appears in the center of the frame.

Subject is too high

Good subject position



To fit the print formats, the Kiosk trims all pictures slightly on the top and bottom. The cropping varies, based on the ID Photo size selection. The preview image closely represents the image proportions and appearance of the final print. Cropping is most noticeable with the 2 x 2 in. ID Photo size.

If a white background is required, the lighting for the background should be similar to the lighting on your subject.

Make sure that there is not a large distance between the subject and the background.

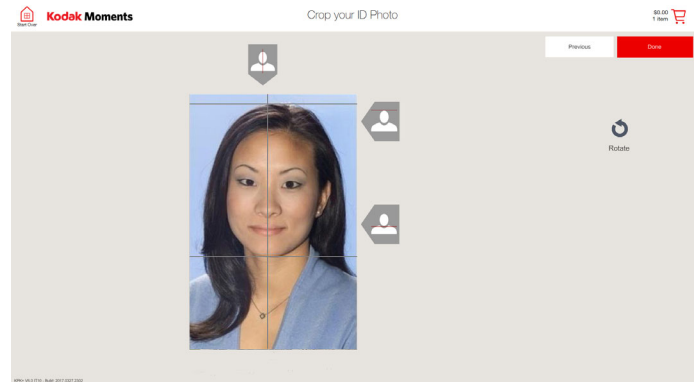

# 9 Managing Orders and Reprints

To access the output and reprint queues, touch the button that appears in the upper top of the screen. This button changes in appearance according to the activity of the Kiosk. You can also access the output and reprint queues if you touch the Menu icon, in the upper left corner of the screen, and then touch *Order Management*.

**IMPORTANT:** *If you have the print password enabled and you touch Order Management, the system prompts you for the print password.*



*Active*—appears when an order is processing.



*Resend*—appears when the completed order screen is visible. Informs the retailer that orders can be resent.



*Error*—appears when an error occurs on the Kiosk. Touch *Error* to display a full description of the error message. See [“Troubleshooting” on page 30-1](#) for more information on handling error messages.

### Canceling Marketplace Orders

1. From the Main screen, touch the manage orders button.
2. Touch *Marketplace Order Release*.
3. Select the order that you would like to cancel.
4. Touch *Cancel Order*.

  - Yes if you want to cancel the order.
  - No if you do not want to cancel the order.



# 10 Recovering Orders

If an error occurs when a customer is using the Kiosk, the order may be able to be recovered after the Kiosk restarts.

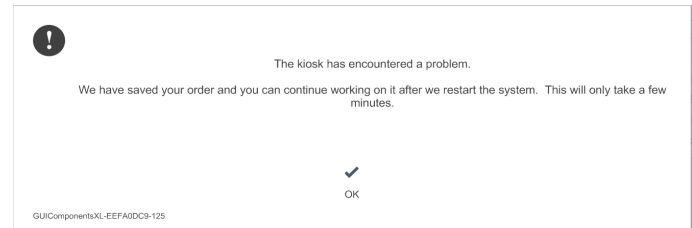

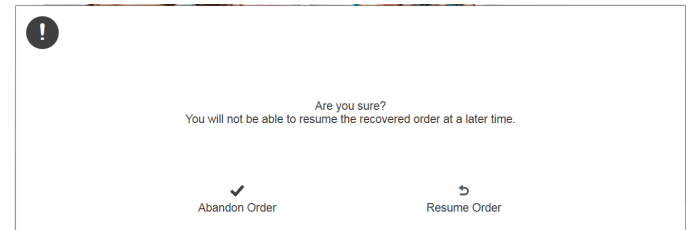

2. If you want to recover your order, touch **Yes** at the message prompt.



3. If you do not want to recover your order, touch *No Thanks* at the message prompt.
4. At, "Are you sure?", you can select:
  - *Abandon Order*—to remove your order and start over.
  - *Resume Order*—continue and print your order.



5. Once the order resumes:

- If you are using a Camera Card, USB drive, or CD/DVD as input, the pictures are automatically detected when the input devices is reinserted.
- If you are using Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, FACEBOOK, FLICKR, DROPBOX, or GOOGLE Photos, you must log in again before the pictures are automatically detected.

NOTE: If the images do not match the images selected before the Kiosk restarted, the work flow will not be able to continue.

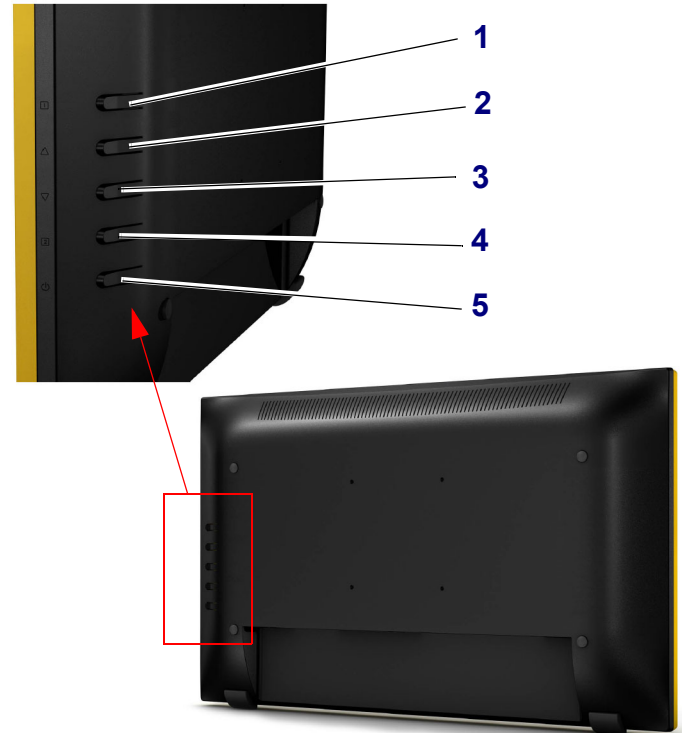
## Using the Controls

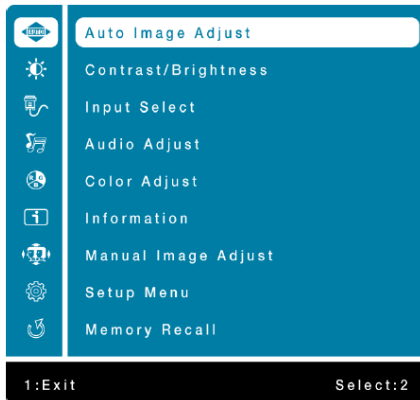

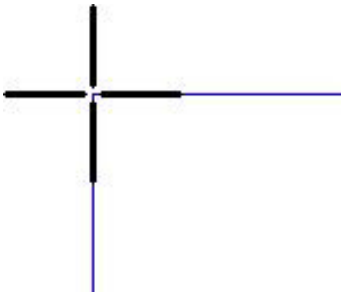

  - a. Touch and hold your finger on the target.
  - b. Touch and hold your finger on the target that appears in the lower right.
  - c. Touch and hold your finger on the target that appears in the upper right.
  - d. Touch the screen and make sure that the cursor follows your finger.
  - e. Touch the check mark if the cursor follows your finger.

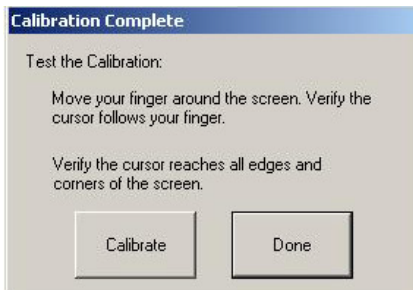
*If you do not respond within the time-out period, the calibration is canceled and you return to the Manage Devices screen.*

- f. Touch the arrow if the cursor does not follow your finger. You return to the target screen. Repeat step 6.

7. If the target appears in the lower left corner:
  - a. Touch and hold your finger on the target.
  - b. Touch and hold your finger on the target that appears in the upper right.

*Do not touch the screen at this time!*

- c. When the following screen appears, touch the screen to make sure that the cursor follows your finger.



- d. Touch *Done* if the cursor follows your finger.

*If you do not respond within the time-out period, the calibration is canceled and you return to the Manage Devices screen.*

- e. Touch *Calibrate* if the cursor does not follow your finger. You return to the target screen. Repeat step 7.

8. If this target appears in the lower left corner:



- a. Touch and hold your finger on the target until "OK" appears in the gray circle.



- b. Repeat Steps a-b for each additional target that appears.

NOTE: A target appears in each corner of the screen.

*If you do not respond within the time-out period, the calibration is canceled and you return to the Manage Devices screen.*

## ***Using the Touch-Screen Display***

### **Cleaning the Touch-Screen Display**

To keep the touch-screen display in good working condition:

- Keep the surrounding area vacuumed and litter-free.
- Protect the touch-screen display from tobacco smoke, dust, and liquid spills.
- Clean the outside of the touch-screen display cabinet using a soft, clean, lint-free cloth slightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Rinse the cloth with clear water, wring it dry, and wipe the cabinet to remove any detergent residue.

#### **IMPORTANT:**

*Do not apply the cleaner from a spray bottle. The cleaner could seep into the touch-screen display and cause damage.*

1. Shut down the Kiosk and disconnect the console from the power outlet before you clean it.

#### **IMPORTANT:**

*Do not apply liquid or aerosol spray cleaners directly on the screen or cabinet.*

*Do not use any type of abrasive pad, alkaline cleaner, scouring powder or solvent (such as petroleum distillates, acetone, or benzene) to clean the touch-screen display. Avoid getting liquids inside the touch-screen display. If liquid does get inside, have a qualified service technician check it before you power it on again.*

2. Wipe the touch-screen with a soft, clean, lint-free cloth slightly moistened with a non-ammonia based glass cleaner.
3. Make sure that the touch-screen display is completely dry before you reconnect the power cord and turn the power on.

## Troubleshooting

Problem	Possible Solution
No picture on the touch-screen display.	Verify: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li data-bbox="363 337 683 400">● The console power switch is turned on.</li><li data-bbox="363 420 759 517">● The power cord is plugged in and the outlet is known to be working.</li></ul>
The touch-screen display does not respond to touch.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li data-bbox="363 534 762 627">● Make sure there is nothing taped or touching the screen.</li><li data-bbox="363 647 762 744">● Calibrate the touch-screen display (see <a href="#">page 11-5</a>).</li><li data-bbox="363 764 735 827">● Turn the Kiosk off, then back on.</li></ul>

### 13 Using the Hub and Spoke Feature

The Hub and Spoke feature lets your store offer more options to fulfill customer orders by allowing Spoke stores to share printers with the Hub store.

A Hub store uses satellite Kiosks and a KODAK Adaptive Picture Exchange and typically houses all of the printers. A Spoke store typically consists of satellite Kiosks and has few or no printers.

When the Hub and Spoke feature is enabled, a new button called *Multiple Days* appears within the workflow of products that are fulfilled through the Hub store.

A shipping label is printed at the Hub store. The label contains customer information and store shipping information. The order is shipped to the Spoke store for customer pickup.

To use this feature, you must:

- Have Net-to-Retail enabled and registered on the Hub. See [“Configuring the Net-to-Retail Feature” on page 9-9](#).
- Satellite the HUB APEX to the Spoke Kiosks.
- Configure prices for all products on the HUB Kiosk.
- Create a HUB catalog at the HUB Kiosk.
- Set the required address information in Store Information on the Spoke Kiosks. See [“Setting the Retailer Store Information” on page 2-8](#).
- Enable the Hub and Spoke feature. See [“Setting the Print Hub Options”](#).
- Enable the applications in User Mode. See [“Setting the User Modes for Hub Applications” on page 13-9](#).
- Have a Hub Retailer ID and a Hub Store ID.
- Load the Print HUB Catalog on the Spoke Kiosk.

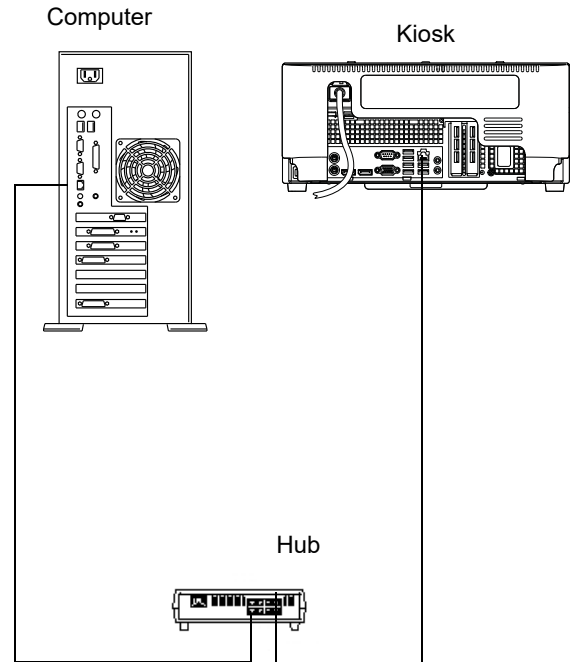



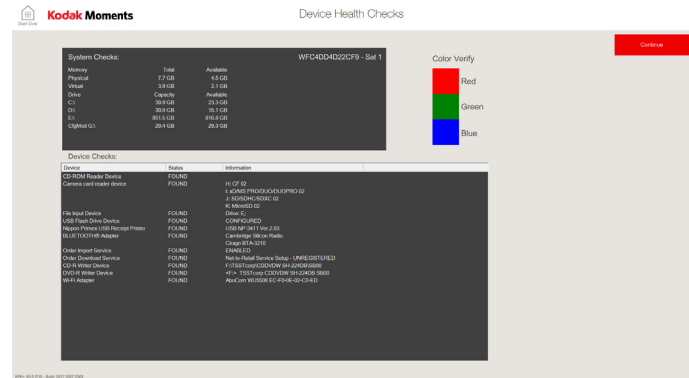

Your application software may be on a USB Flash Drive (see [page 16-22](#)) or DVD (see [page 16-23](#)). Follow the installation instructions for the appropriate media.

**IMPORTANT:** *All jobs should be released and allowed to complete uploading before updating the Application software. If the jobs are not released before installing the software, they will be lost. See [“Using the Upload Queue Manager” on page 9-4](#).*

## Installing Software from a USB Flash Drive



1. From the Setup screen, touch *Install Software*.
2. At “Insert Application Media”, insert the USB flash drive into an available USB port:
  - Use the USB port on the front of the Console.
  - If there is not a USB port on the front of the Console, use an available USB port on the back of the Console.
  - If there is not an available USB port, disconnect a USB device (e.g., a printer) from the Console.
3. Wait for the USB flash drive to blink and then touch *OK*.
4. At “Installation USB Device Detected”, touch *Install*.

5. At “Installation Complete”:
  - a. Remove the USB flash drive from the USB port. If you disconnected a USB device in Step 2, reconnect it now.
  - b. Touch *OK*.
  - c. Store the USB flash drive with the Kiosk software.
6. When the software installation is complete, verify that “KPK+ V4.0” or later appears in the lower left corner of the screen. If it does not appear, install the software again. If it still does not appear, contact Service and Support.
7. Print a picture to test the Kiosk.

If you have any questions about installing the software, contact Service and Support.

## **Installing Software from DVD**



1. From the Setup screen, touch *Install Software*.
2. At “Insert Application Media”:
  - a. Insert the DVD into the DVD drive.
  - b. Wait approximately 10 seconds.
  - c. Touch *OK*.
3. At “Installation CD Detected”, touch *Install*.
4. At “Installation Complete”:
  - a. Remove the DVD.
  - b. Touch *OK*.
  - c. Store the CDs with the Kiosk software.
5. When the software installation is complete, verify that “KPK+ V4.0” or later appears in the lower left corner of the screen. If it does not appear, install the software again. If it still does not appear, contact Service and Support.

6. Print a picture to test the Kiosk.

If you have any questions about installing the software, contact Service and Support.



## **Installing the Application Software After a System Recovery**

If you have to perform a system recovery, after the Kiosk restarts, the Insert Application CD screen appears.

1. At “Insert Application CD”:
  - a. Insert the Initialization CD into the CD drive.
  - b. Wait approximately 10 seconds.
  - c. Touch *OK*.
2. At “Software Installation”, touch *Check for Media*.
3. At “Installation CD Detected”, touch *Install*.
4. At “Insert Application Media”, remove the Initialization CD and store it with the Kiosk software.
5. If your software is on a USB Flash Drive, continue with Step 2 of “Installing Software from a USB Flash Drive” on page 16-22.

6. If your software is on a DVD, continue with Step 2 of “Installing Software from DVD” on page 16-23.
7. After the installation is complete, you must install the enablement software if you have one of the following:
  - Any Lab Kit
  - Any Payment Processing Kit
  - US Limit of Liability
  - Serial Receipt Printer

NOTE: See the installation instructions packed with the enablement CD.

## **Installing the Enablement Software**

If the Main screen appears when you turn on the Kiosk, continue with “Installing the Software from the Setup Screen”.

OR

If the “Insert Enabler CD” prompt appears when you turn on the Kiosk, continue with “Installing the Software from the Enabler CD Screen” on page 16-25.

## Installing the Software from the Setup Screen



1. From the Setup screen, touch *Install Software*.
2. Insert the Enablement Software CD into the CD-RW drive.
3. At “Software Installation”, touch *Check for Media*.
4. Touch *Install*.
5. Touch *Next*.
6. At the Setup Complete screen:
  - a. Remove the CD from the CD-RW drive.
  - b. Touch *Finish*.
7. Store the software with the other Kiosk software.

## Installing the Software from the Enabler CD Screen

1. At the “Insert Enabler CD” prompt, insert the Enablement CD into the CD-RW drive.
2. Touch *OK*.
3. Touch *Install*.
4. Touch *Next*.
5. At the Setup Complete screen:
  - a. Remove the CD from the CD-RW drive.
  - b. Touch *Finish*.
6. Store the software with the other Kiosk software.

## Contacting Service and Support

Verify that you have completed these steps:

- Check for error messages on the touch-screen display, and record them.
- Check for error messages or error lights on connected hardware devices (e.g., printers), and record them.
- Check that the hardware devices are connected correctly and turned on.
- Check that the paper and ribbon are loaded correctly in the printers.
- Check for issues with the input source (e.g., scratched CDs or unsupported file formats).
- Consider changes that were made recently (e.g., hardware or software that was added or removed).
- Shut down the Kiosk through the software, turn off the main power (at the cabinet or power strip, if the Kiosk has one), wait five seconds, and turn on the power.

For hardware issues, also:

- run Device Health Check (see [“Accessing the Device Health Check Screen” on page 16-1](#)) to identify hardware errors, and record them.
- see the chapter for the device.

For software issues, also:

- do the hardware step above if buttons are missing from the main screen.
- run Application Health Check (see [“Accessing the Application Health Check Screen” on page 16-3](#)) to identify software errors, and record them.
- check that the Setup screens are configured correctly (see the [“Setting up the Kiosk” on page 2-1](#)).

For print quality issues, also:

- check the quality of the input images.
- clean the printer (see the chapter for your printer).
- clean the print scanner (see the chapter for your print scanner), if the problem appears in scanned images.

If you cannot resolve the issue, contact Service and Support. Record and provide (along with any errors that appeared):

- K Number of the Kiosk (inside the cabinet or on the back)
- version of the software (lower-left corner of the Main screen)
