Recharging

 To recharge the battery use the USB cable to connect the unit to the PC.

LCD screen shows the icon change from to to when it is fully recharged.



Note!

- It takes approx 3 hours to completely recharge a fully discharged battery.
- Recharging is not interrupted while downloading/uploading files from/to PC.
- Recharge the product using USB cable when LCD screen is not activated.
- ●LCD screen shows (when any error in recharge process occurs. Try to recharge few times more. If the error recurs, contact an Service Center.

Power

 When the unit is turned on initially the battery icon indicates various charge levels.

- 2. Duration of continuous play.
- 17 hours under the following conditions:
- ① MP3: 128Kbps, 32Khz
- Volume is set no higher than 15
- (3) Power Volume is not in use



- *When to recharge the battery:
- ① Buttons are not functioning properly.
- ② LCD is not activated by pushing the power button.

Connecting to a PC

Note!

- What's USB (Universal Serial Bus)? This is a new connection system between PC and peripheral devices.
- Connect the USB cable supplied with the product into a USB port in PC.
 Any unexpected error can be happened when connecting to the USB port in front of PC or USB hub.
- Windows version 98SE or lower will not detect the DAH-1500 as a peripheral device. To have your PC detect the player Install the Program CD supplied.

USB cable connection

Connect one end of the cable into a USB port on the back of your PC and the other end to the earphone jack of the DAH-1500.



Disconnecting

- ■Windows ME, 2000 and XP Operating Systems
- Double click on the green arrow on the right-bottom part of the initial Window screen.

Power ON/OFF

Turn Power ON



Press and hold the play/pause button to turn the power on.

Note!

- When the battery needs recharging the LCD will display the 'Battery Low' icon.
- Recharge the battery when LCD is not activated.

Turning Power OFF



Press and hold the play/pause button to turn the unit off.

Note!

- · When no button manipulation in pause condition is done after the set period of time for "Auto Power Off," it automatically turns off the power.
- · In case with no earphone connected after a certain period time, it automatically turns the power off.
- · When you try to play a file after the restarting of the product, it completely recovers all previous setting. All track numbers, equalizer and other settings are recovered. (Resume function in second unit)

Press the play/pause button once to play a selected file.

Stop



Press the play/pause button once more to stop play.

Volume control



- Press "+" or "-" to increase or decrease the volume incrementally.
- Press and hold "+" or "-" to increase or decrease the volume continuously.

Music Set

Equalizer

Select "Equalizer" to select an equalization mode suited to the genre of music you want to play (i.e. Normal, Rock, Jazz, Pop, Classic, Live, User Set).







User Equalizer

Customize the equalization by selecting Music Set>User Equ>Base/Treble. You can set the base and treble ranges between -7 and +7.









Music Set

Play Mode

In 'Play Mode' you can select how you want to play your files (i.e. Repeat all files, Repeat files in the folder, Random play in sequence, Random play in the folder).



ALL All Repeat : all music files are repeatedly played in sequence.

FLD Folder Repeat : music files in current folder are repeatedly played in sequence.

ALR All Random: all files are randomly played.

R Folder Random: files in current folder are randomly played.

Music Set

Audio Boost

With Audio Boost you can enjoy enhanced sound with increased power output.



Off: Files play at normal volume and power output.

On: Files play at higher volume with higher power output.

*Note!

Since Audio Boost uses more power it consumes battery life quicker than normal mode.

Display

Choose 'Display" from the main menu

Backlight On Time

It enables you set backlighting periods of LCD among 5, 15, 30 seconds and always ON.







Contrast

This function let you set the brightness of LCD from 1 to 10 levels.







Language

You can select preferable language of English, Korean or Chinese.







Display

Use ID3

The function enables you set music file information (File name, ID3 info) displayed on LCD. 'USE ID3' allows you to enter additional information about your saved files.







File Name: Displays file names

ID3 Tag: Displays ID3 tags instead of file names

*Note!

Files with no ID3 tag info displays file names only.

Scroll Speed

This function sets text scrolling speed on LCD display. Choose between Fast ('Twice') and 'Normal'.







Twice: File names scroll at higher speed on LCD.

Normal: File name streams on LCD at normal speed.

Etc Set

Select 'Etc Set" from the main menu

OS Ver

The function shows unit firmware information ('OS').







Memory

Displays Total memory, Used memory, and Free memory.









Set Time

Select 'Set Time' to set the time, day, date, month and year.











Press the button to view the set time in Play and FM Radio Modes.

Etc Set

Auto Power Off

Using this feature while the unit is paused or stopped allows you to set the unit to turn off automatically after a set time (30 seconds/ 1minute/ 2minutes/ 5minutes/ 10minutes or disabled) while playing as long you don't touch the controls otherwise.







Sleep Mode

You can set the power to automatically turn off after a set period of time (10/20/30/60 minutes or disabled).







Default

Selecting the default initializes all preset settings.









Yes: All preset information is initialized.

No: Cancels initialization.

System Requirements

Minimum requirements for PC system are as follows

- ■Microsoft OS (Windows 98SE, ME, 2000 or XP)
- ■CD-ROM Drive
- ■Pentium 200Mhz or more
- ■RAM 32MB or more (64MB for Windows ME or later version)
- ■128MB or more hard disk space

(Additional hard disk may be needed for saving music files)

- ■USB port available
- ■Mac. 9.X-X


- ■The Program CD allows you to upload or download files without installing other additional software.
- ■For Windows 98SE Users: install the software first before using the player (otherwise, PC will not detect the player as a peripheral).

- ■The unit downloads or uploads all types of data files (*. jpg, *. xls, *. hwp, ...). It functions as a removable disk as well as an MP3 player.
- To download files connect USB cable, select your file and right click on "Copy".





- Electronics in the immediate environment may be interfering with unit functioning.

6. LCD is not activated?



- Check LCD brightness setting (Menu> Display> Contrast).
- Check the battery. Recharge it with a USB cable if needed.
