That interview was prompted by statements had allegedly made at his school, Dakota Ridge High School. The results of that interview are covered in a separate FD-302, this case number.

At the request of Sergeant Kenneth Ester of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department, the writer and Investigator Wilson responded to the residence in order to request permission to search the residence for any potential explosive devices or weapons.

had been picked up by Jefferson County Sheriff's Deputies and was apparently transported to Littleton Porter Hospital for a mental health evaluation.

and his wife, were advised of the purpose of the investigator's visit, and the desire to make sure that was not currently in possession of any explosive devices or weapons. The offered to allow investigators to conduct a search of areas used by Both signed a consent to search form, and then led investigators to several areas within the residence. Investigators searched an upstairs room with a computer, an adjoining bedroom, the garage, and basement workshop of the residence. No contraband was observed. Investigators did note the sparseness of personal possessions and very neat condition of the rooms. The advised that they kept on to keep the rooms neat, and said that he spent a lot of time at friend's homes.

The consent to search form was retained by Investigator Thomas Wilson of the Aurora Police Department.

04/23/99 Date of transcription , Date of Birth: was contacted by the interviewing agents on April 23, 1999, at the Juvenile Assessment Center, 1200 Johnson Rd., Golden, Colorado. He was advised of the personal and professional identities of the writer and Investigator Thomas Wilson of the Aurora Police Department. was being detained at the request of the staff at Dakota Ridge High School for interfering with educators, and was being interviewed by Juvenila Assessment Specialist Dave Bell upon the arrival of the investigators. During this time, the writer and Investigator Wilson spoke with father, who had responded to pick up his son at the center. Investigators advised the senior of the desire to speak with regarding statements attributed to him, which evidently led to his detention at the school. Mr. advised that he had no objections to his son being interviewed. Mr. advised that he did not have any knowledge of bringing a pipebomb to school, but stated that had extensive knowledge about bombs and electronics. Mr. stated that got his information from the Internet. He stated that would never hurt anybody, and refused to hunt because he did not want to hurt animals. was released from the Juvenile Assessment Center by Dave Bell at approximately 1:50 PM. agreed to be interviewed by the investigators, and an interview room at the assessment center was made available for that purpose. was advised that he was not in custody, and was free to leave at any time. father was present for the interview. currently resides at S. Quail Way, Littleton, Colorado, phone (303) advised investigators that he understood that he had originally been brought to the center based on some statements he had originally made. stated that apparently two or more students were upset by statements he made at Dakota Ridge High School, where he is a sophomore. stated that he heard that the statements attributed to him were things like, JC-001-025711 " Golden, Colorado Investigation on 04/23/99 Date distance 04/23/99 File / 4-DN-57405

"This isn't over yet' (referring to the Columbine High School event) and statements suggesting that was contemplating doing the same thing at Dakota Ridge. denied making any such statements. He stated that everyone on campus was talking about the Columbine incident, and he engaged in several conversations with others on the subject. stated that he believed that someone may have overheard one of these conversations and misconstrued what he said. He acknowledged that he did say something to the effect that this was not over yet, but based this on a conversation with a fellow student and neighbor who's father is a SWAT team member.

The preliminary information provided to investigators prior to the interview suggested that had been seen with a pipe bomb on campus a week earlier. When asked about this, stated that he had not brought a pipe bomb to school, and had never been contacted by authorities in reference to having one during that time period. The mentioned that he was involved in working on computer hardware, and often brought various parts to school. He stated that someone may have seen one of these on thought it was some type of explosive device. The stated that he recalled several occasions in the past when someone would jokingly ask him if what he had was a bomb, and believes he probably answered "yes" on at least one occasion.

advised that he had made pipe bombs in the past, and had downloaded copies of the Anarchist Cookbook from the Internet. Stated that he printed the cookbook up, and made some changes on it on things he felt were incorrect. Stated that other projects he attempted from the cookbook were something called RDX, an explosive substance reported to be ten times as powerful as C-4. Salso attempted to make napalm, using gasoline and soap. Stated that he never blew up any object with the devices, and always blew them off in sandy areas away from flammable substances.

stated that the only pipe bombs he made were made using copper pipe, which would not have "hard frags" when they blew up. He advised that he obtained the powder for the device from fireworks he had obtained, including "artillery cannonballs".

stated that his family recently signed up on America On Line (AOL), but that he had only used it once. was asked his screen name, and stated that he had forgotten it the last time he attempted to log on. The writer reminded him that the screen name usually comes up on the screen during log on, while the password is hidden. then remembered that his screen name was Mothra1492. He stated that Mothra was a fictional character in the Japanese Godzilla films. He stated that there was no significance to the "1492" number sequence at the end of the screen name.

advised that he often used the computer at school, and at a neighbor's across the street to access the Internet. He advised that the neighbor's name was Chris ALVARADO. He stated that he did not have a web page, but that his friend, Will RICE, was building him one.

stated that he attended a summer school session at Columbine High School last summer, but did not know anyone from CHS currently. He advised that he was not familiar with any of the victims or suspects identified in the media regarding the CHS event. He stated that he was not acquainted with any members of the "Trenchcoat Mafia", and was not a member of any group on campus. He did advise that he has some friends who are "Goths".

stated that he has few friends, and named classmate Will RICE as his closest friend. Investigators noted that some of the statements from students mentioned and a subject named "Clint", and was asked if he had a friend by that name. stated that he did have a friend named Clint CRISWELL.

advised that during the previous school year he had been contacted by a federal agent from an unknown agency and asked about his knowledge and involvement with explosives, which he stated he discussed in detail with the agent.

told investigators that he had heard other parties discussing the fact that Columbine High School was the third one on "the list", and that Chatfield was first and Dakota Ridge the second. stated that he thought this information was obtained from the Internet. stated that he heard this around from several people. When pushed for a name, he stated
