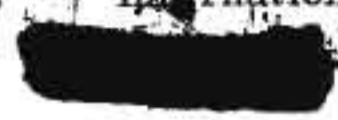

Mrs. [redacted] telephoned today. Her daughter, [redacted] went to Nairobi, Kenya on August 16--and then moved on to Mombasa. She stayed at the Hotel Salisbury (PO Box 509) Nairobi while she was there.

I found out from Rev. Mr. Klotzle of Universalist-Unitarian Committee last week that BARAK OBAMA has two wives--one in Africa and one in Honolulu. Mr. Klotzle is not impressed with Obama.

MEMO FOR FILE:

Subject of this file, Barack H. Obama, telephoned the Dep Sec, Boston on 6/18/64 and requested he be told the specific grounds for the denial of his application for extension of stay. Quoted him the letter from Harvard dated 5/27/64 (in file) and told him application had been denied based on the facts in this letter and after a very careful review of his entire file. He was not ~~xxxxxxx~~ satisfied with this and wanted more specifics which he did not get from the undersigned.

Alien was told decision in his case had been made by the District Director and was FINAL. He then wanted to know if he brought in a letter from Harvard showing he was to continue there and would have funds (this after stating he could not leave by July 8, 1964 as he did not have the funds to do so) who he should see. Gave him the name of S. J. J. Golden, TC Section, but told him it was felt that there was no point in this as the decision made in his case was FINAL and the undersigned could see no reason for or possibility of reconsideration or change therein.

Mr. Obama phoned asking to talk to Mr. Hamilton. As Mr. Hamilton was in conference, I told him his case had been given full consideration and that the DS's decision of June 9 was final & he would be expected to depart by July 8 as 30 days to arrange for departure was considered more than ample. He stated he could not obtain funds from his sponsor (African American Institute) by July 8 - \$200 needed, and he required another month to complete an economics paper. He said he was going to submit a letter from Economic Dept of Harvard to support this for an extension. m.s.

He submitted his application for extension before his time expired; however, in view of correspondence in his file, Harvard was contacted telephonically. They weren't very impressed with him and asked for us to hold up action on his application until they decided what action they could take in order to get rid of him. They were apparently having difficulty with his financial arrangements and couldn't seem to figure out how many wives he had.

Attached is copy of their letter of May 27, 1964, to subject advising him to terminate his stay in the U.S. and return to Kenya to carry on his research and to write his thesis.

In view of the above, it is recommended that his application for extension be denied; that he be placed under docket control; and given until July 8, 1964, to depart.

In checking through your folder we have noticed that your permit to stay in the United States, first issued in August 1959, expired on April 29, 1964.


We understand from the Department of Economics that you have completed your formal course work, and your general examinations. In order to complete your work for the Ph.D. degree there remains only your research and the writing of your thesis.

We have also been informed that neither the Department of Economics nor the Graduate School of Arts & Sciences has any further funds to support you in Cambridge. As you know this office has no money of its own for foreign students. We have, therefore, come to the conclusion that you should terminate your stay in the United States and return to Kenya to carry on your research and the writing of your thesis.

In order to give you time to make arrangements for your departure we have asked the Immigration & Naturalization Service to give you until June 19 to make the necessary preparations. You will be glad to know that they have accepted our recommendation and have extended your stay until that date.

Mr. Henry, FSA, Harvard University phoned 5/19/64.. Said he got in touch with one of the Deans at Harvard and explained the situation re subject to him, and he tried, in turn, to get in touch with the Head of the Department where subject is, and they finally connected today.

OBAMA has passed his general exams, which indicates that on academic grounds he is entitled to stay around here and write his thesis; however, they are going to try to cook something up to ease him out. All three will have to agree on this, however. They are planning on telling him that they will not give him any money, and that he had better return to Kenya and prepare his thesis at home.

Mr. Henry said this would probably take about a month to get all the details settled; that he would notify us on June 19, 1964, on their progress.



MEMO FOR FILE

Mrs. McCabe, University of Hawaii, Foreign Student advisor, called on 4/10/61 and reported that BARACK H. OBAMA, a student at the University since 1959 was married on February 2, 1961 to Stanley Ann Dunham, a United States citizen from Seattle, Washington in Maui, Hawaii. The problem is that when he arrived in the U.S. the subject had a wife in Kenya.

The Subject was born on June 18, 1934 in Kisumu, Nyanza, Kenya, Africa and entered the U.S. at New York, N.Y. on August 9, 1959 as an F student. He has received extension of stay to August 8, 1961 and has received permission to accept employment up to 25 hours per week. He apparently is a bone-fide student and Mrs. McCabe states that he is very intelligent.

Mrs. McCabe further states that Subject has been running around with several girls since he first arrived here and last summer she cautioned him about his playboy ways. Subject replied that he would "try" to stay away from the girls.

Subject told Mrs McCabe that in Kenya all that is necessary to be divorced is to tell the wife that she is divorced and that constitutes a legal divorce. Subject claims to have been divorced from his wife in Kenya in this method.

Polygamy is not an excludable or deportable or deportation charge as Subject is a non-immigrant and this is waived under 201(d). If he were convicted of bigamy we might get a deportation charge but not before. Subject is a bone-fide student at present.

Recommend that Subject be closely questioned before another extension is granted - and denial be considered. If his USC wife tries to petition for him make sure an investigation is conducted as to the bone-fide of the marriage.

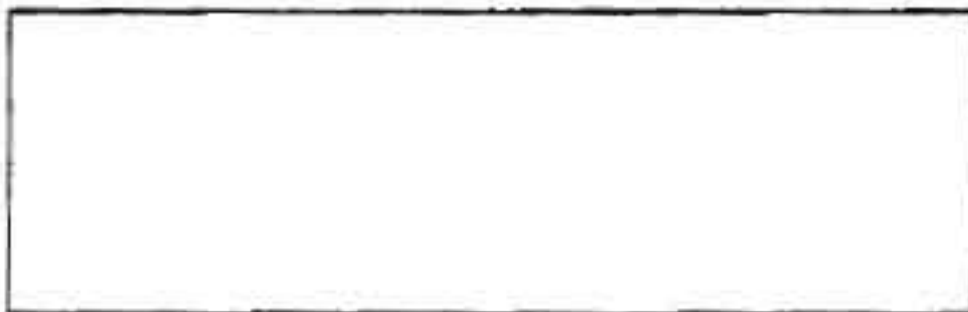

(Documentary evidence of means of support must be submitted to the American Consular Officer to whom the visa application is made. If arrangements for part-time employment on the campus of the accepting institution of learning have been made, a statement from the institution to that effect must be attached or specified under "Conditions of Admission".)

5. I understand that the following conditions must be met by me if I am admitted into the United States:

a. No alien student admitted to the United States temporarily may be employed for a wage or salary or engage in business while in the United States unless it is necessary for him to do so to defray part of his living expenses, and then only if permission to do so has been granted by the Immigration and Naturalization Service. If arrangements for part-time employment have been made with the accepting institution of learning as indicated in the answer to question 4 above, permission to accept employment may be granted at the time of the student's admission into the United States.

b. All alien students admitted temporarily are permitted to remain in the United States only for the period fixed at the time of admission, unless they apply to the nearest office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service on Form I-530 thirty days prior to the expiration of the period of admission authorized, and obtain an extension of their stay.

c. All aliens in the United States on the first day of January of each year must submit a written notice of their address to the Immigration and Naturalization Service by the thirty-first day of January. In addition, a notice must be sent within 10 days after each change of address. Regardless of whether they move, all alien students temporarily in the United States are required to file a written notice of their address every three months. Printed forms obtainable at any United States immigration office or post office should be used in making the annual address report, the change of address report, and the three-month address report.

d. At the time an alien student departs from the United States, his temporary entry permit (Form 257a or I-94 C) is to be surrendered to a representative of the steamship or airline if he leaves via seaport or airport; to a Canadian immigration officer, if he leaves across the Canadian border; or to a United States immigration officer, if he leaves across the Mexican border. An alien student who departs temporarily from the United States during the period of his authorized stay in this country is required to be in possession of a valid student's visa when applying for readmission to the United States.

e. An alien student admitted temporarily is admitted only for the purpose of pursuing a full course of studies at a specified school, college, or other educational institution. If, after being admitted, such student desires to transfer to another school, college, or educational institution other than that specified at the time of his admission, the student must make a written application in advance to the United States immigration office having jurisdiction over the place where the student resides, for permission to make such a transfer.

f. Whenever employment for practical training is required or recommended by the institution or place of study attended by the applicant, the district director or the officer in charge may permit employment of the alien for a six-month period subject to extension for not over two additional six-month periods, but any such extensions shall be granted only upon certification by the school and the training agency that the practical training cannot be completed in a shorter period of time.

6. If an alien student in the United States has any questions concerning his immigration status, he should not hesitate to call or write to the nearest immigration office. That office will be pleased to help the student.

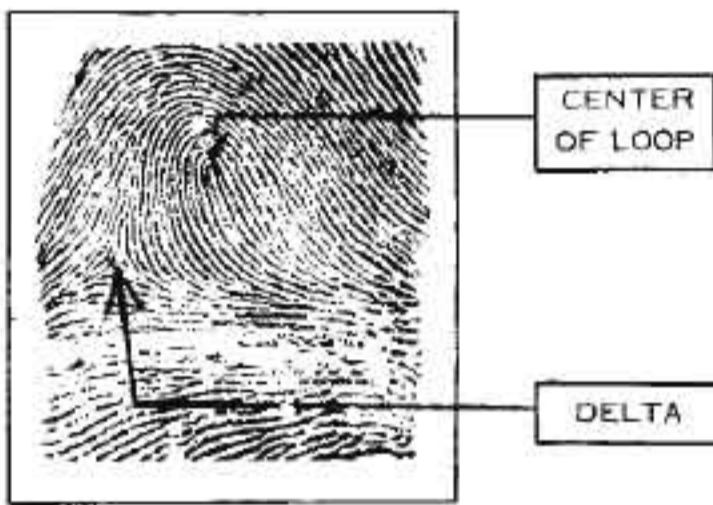

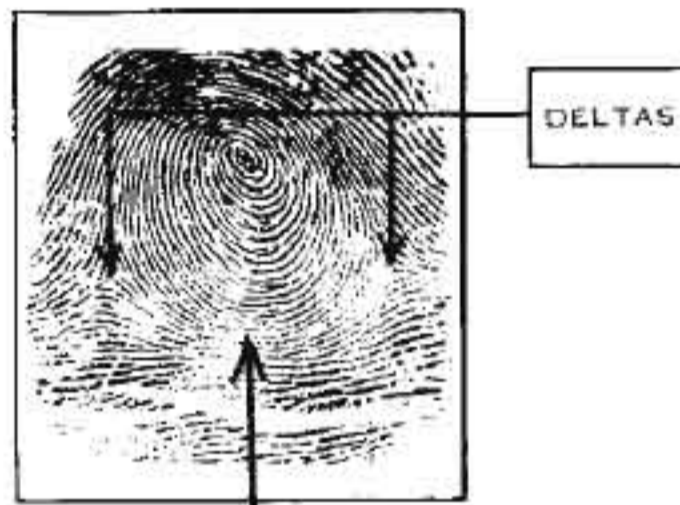
