

I have talked to the Department of Economics and I understand that as of now you have not registered a thesis title with them. Under the circumstances, I could not consider issuing an I-20 to you until the following steps have been completed and the Economics Department approves your return.

- The Department is informed as to your thesis subject, and under what faculty member you are writing it.
- 2. We have some indication as to how near completion it is.
- It would be well, I should think, if you sent your Department any completed chapters in your thesis to help them in judging your progress.

[woted him the letter from Harvard dated 5/27/64 (in file) and told him application had been desied based on the facts in this letter and after a very careful review of his entire.file. He was not axtisfar satisfied with this and wanted more specifics which he did not get from the undersigned.

Alien was told decision in his case had been made by the District Director and was FINAL. He then wanted to know if he brought in a letter from Harvard showing he was to continue there and would have funds (this after stating he could not leave by July 8, 1964 as he did not have the funds to do so) who he should see. Bave him the name of S. J. J. Bolden, T C Section, but told him it was felt that there was no point in this as the decision made in his case was FINAL and the undersigned could see no reason for or possibility of reconsideration or change therein.

He submitted his application for extension before his time expired; however, in view of correspondence in his file, Harvard was contacted telephonically. They weren't very impressed with him and asked for us to hold up action on his application until they decided what action they could take in order to get rid of him. They were apparently having difficulty with his financial arrangements and couldn't seem to figure out how many wives he had.

Attached is copy of their letter of May 27, 1964, to subject advising him to terminate his stay in the U.S. and return to Kenya to carry on his research and to write his thesis.

in view of the above, it is recommended that his application for extension be denied; that he be placed under docket control; and given until July 8, 1964, to depart.

Dear Mr. Obama,

In checking through your folder we have noticed that your permit to stay in the United States, first issued in August 1959, expired on April 29, 1964.

We understand from the Department of Economics that you have completed your formal course work, and your general examinations. In order to complete your work for the Ph.D. degree there remains only your research and the writing of your thesis.

We have also been informed that neither the Department of Economics nor the Graduate School of Arts & Sciences has any further funds to support you in Cambridge. As you know this office has no money of its own for foreign students. We have, therefore, come to the conclusion that you should terminate your stay in the United States and return to Kenya to carry on your research and the writing of your thesis.

In order to give you time to make arrangements for your departure we have asked the Immigration & Maturalization Service to give you until June 19 to make the necessary preparations. You will be glad to know that they have accepted our recommendation and have extended your stay until that date.

Re: All 938 537 - BARACK PUSSEIN OBAMA

Mr. Henry, FSA, Harvard University phoned 5/19/64.. Said he got in touch with one of the Deans at Harvard and explained the situation re subject to him, and he tried, in turn, to get in touch with the Head of the D partment where subject is, and they finally connected today.

OBAMA has passed his general exams, which indicates that on academic grounds he is entitled to stay around here and write his thesis; however, they are going to try to cook something up to ease him out. All three will have to agree on this, however. They are planning on telling him that they will not give him any money, and that he had better return to Kenya and prepare his thesis at home.

Mr. Henry said this would probably take about a month to get all the details settled; that he would notify us on June 19, 1964, on their progress.

He said that at this time Harvard does not plan on having OBAMA registered as a full-time student during the academic year 1964-1965 as stated on the I-539 dated 4/21/64. When that was issued, they did think he would be registered there.

Appeared 4/21/64 with I-539. File indicated he had been having trouble with who has since left the U.S. Stated he list entered the U.S. 8/9/59 as student to attend University of Hawaii. Was there from 1959 to 1962 and got B.A. Transferred to Harvard in September 1962 to study for Ph.D. in Economics. Expects to get degree in 2-3 years and then go home. Had not filled in marital status, etc. and employment portion of I-539. E.J.Golden said to hold up extension for present.

Talked with Miss Frost at Harvard as alien claimed he couldn't remember where he had worked in the U.S. She said he works on research at Harvard; and that Mr. Henry, one of the Harvard officials, intends to talk to subject re his marital situation. Harvard thinks he's married to someone in Kenya and someone in Honolulu, but that possibly he belongs to a tribe where multiple marriages are O.K.

Mr. Henry may not talk to him until after his exams in case he might get upset and use that as an excuse for not passing. Harvard will call us with the results of the interview.

After alien stated he was married, he said he was separated and that they may get a divorce. The wife in the Philippines from whom he is separated is a U.S.C. Memo on yellow paper in file indicates he had wife in Kenya when he arrived in U.S. in 1959.

MBAMA, a student at the University since 1959 was married on February 2, 1961 to Stanley Ann Dunham, a United States eitisen from Seattle, Washington in Maui, Hawaii. The problem is that when he arrived in the U.S. the subject had a wife in Kenya.

The Subject was born on June 18, 1934 in Kisumu, Nyanza, Kenya, Africa and entered the U.S. at New York, N.Y. on August 9, 1959 as an F student. He has received extention of stay to August 8, 1961 and has received permission to accept employment up to 25 hours per week. He apparently is a bone-fide student and Mrs. McCabe states that he is very intellegent.

Mrs. Mc Cabe further states that Subject has been running around with several girls since he first arrived here and hast summer she cautioned him about his playboy ways. Subject replied that he would "try" to stayaway from the sirks.

in Kenya all that is mecessary to be diverced is to tell the wife that she is divorced and that constitutes a legal divorce. Subject claims to have been divorced from his wife in Kenya in this method.

Pelygony is not an excludable or annument or departation charge as Subject is a non-immigrant and this is waived under 161(d). If he were convicted of bigamy we might get a deportation charge but not before. Subject is a beme-fide student at present.

Recommend that Subject be closely questioned before another extention is granted - and denial be considered. If his USC wife tries to petition for him make sure an investigation is conducted as to the bene-fide of the marraige.




